MINUTES
MARCH 9, 2021

The Worthington Town Council met in regular session Tuesday, March 9, 2021 at 6:30 at the Town Hall. Members present were Tom Franklin, Kim Archer, Gerren Cullison, and Brian Stoner.

Tom Franklin made the motion to approve the minutes with Kim Archer being the second. Motion carried.

Jeremy and Autumn Smith own a house at 303 N. Myra and the side of the road has at least a 6" drop off. When it rains it floods where the cars are parked. They would like to see something done.

Rick Graves from the county commissioners was at the meeting and was ask about Jane Arthur's building. Their is metal hanging on the front and the awning is dangerous. The back is caving in and it's in bad shape. Greene County is suppose to tear it down, but now there is an issue with the historical society. It would cost \$100,000 to \$250,000 to restore the building.

Kip Arthur brought in his children, Alissa and Alex. They presented a wooden flag that they had made. The police department and the fire department both received one.

The office will open it's doors to the public on Monday, March 15, 2021. Masks will be worn inside the building. Kim Archer made the motion to open and Brian Stoner was the second. Motion carried.

Mike Howell attended the meeting. He is still concerned about the speed that people coming into town and down the hill are going. He would like a stop sign at

Hannah and Extension Streets. The board has agreed that it would cause more problems.


